### **Color Terminology you should understand**

**Temporary Color.** Simply coats your hair shaft and should shampoo out after one shampoo. This type of color WILL NOT lighten your hair. The darker the color the deeper the stain. There is a no mixing or developer. This *can be done after a chemical service.*

**Semi-permanent color** – Washes out after 6-12 shampoos. It will enhance natural color is great for blending gray, out grown highlights or sun lifted hair. WILL NOT lift your hair *This can be done after a chemical service.*

**Demi- Color** – will last up to 28 shampoos, will color gray rich tone on tone shades. This color is for deposit only WILL NOT LIFT or LIGHTEN hair Has a low-level developer which promotes the color to penetrate the hair shaft on the on the shallow cuticle layer. These colors are usually transparent and gel like when mixed. It is also has

conditioners for the hair which adds sheen and body to the hair. *This can be done after a chemical service. Fades away over time*

**Permanent Color**– Will not shampoo out. It grows out; you will have to recolor the new growth. This choice of color service gives you the greatest range of color choice. You can go from black to blonde and anything in between if your hair is health.

\*Any type of color enhancement done after a chemical service may go darker than desired. Consult your stylist about your color possibilities!

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
